We, the undersigned natural persons of the age of twenty-one years or more, acting as incorporators for the purpose of creating a non-profit corporation under the laws of the State of North Carolina, as contained in Chapter 55A of the General Statutes of North Carolina, entitled "Non-Profit Corporation Act", and the several amendments thereto, do hereby set forth.

## ARTICLE I

The period of duration of the corporation shall be Perpetual.

# ARTICLE III

This Association does not contemplate pecuniary gain profit to the members thereof, and the specific purposes for provide is formed are tο for maintenance and preservation of the residence lots and common areas, any private roads or rights of way within that certain area known a s Arlington Park and to promote the health, safety and welfare of the residents within the above-described property any additions thereto as may hereafter be brought within the jurisdictions of this purpose to:

- a. acquire (by gift, purchase, or otherwise), own, hold improve, build upon, operate, maintain, convey, sell, lease, transfer, dedicate for public use or otherwise dispose of real or personal property in connection with the affairs of the Association;
- b. borrow money, and with the assent of two-thirds (2/3) of each class of members, mortgage, pledge, deed in trust, or hypothecate any or all of its real or personal property as security for money borrowed or debts incurred;

- d. participate in mergers and consolidations with other non-profit corporations organized for the same purposes or annex additional residential property and common area, provided, that any such merger, consolidation or annexation shall have the assent of two-thirds (2/3) of each class members;
- e. have and to exercise any and all powers, rights and privileges which a corporation organized under the Non-Profit Corporation Law of the State of North Carolina by law may now or hereafter have or exercise.
